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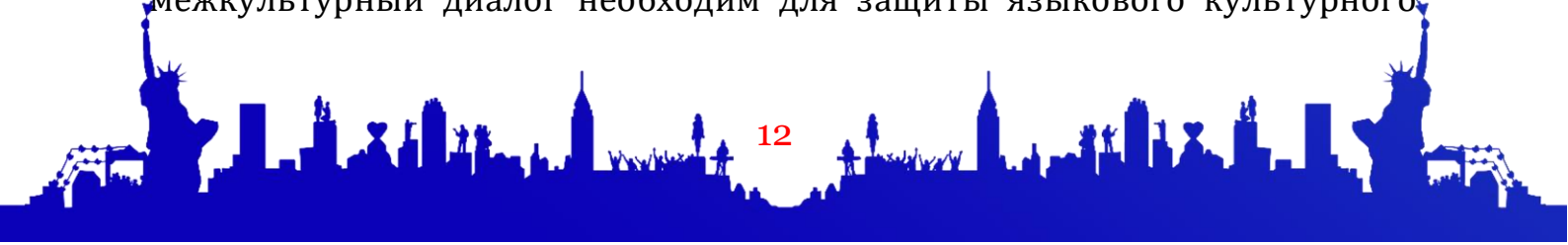

### **Linguistic Cultural Diversity in the Era of Globalization**

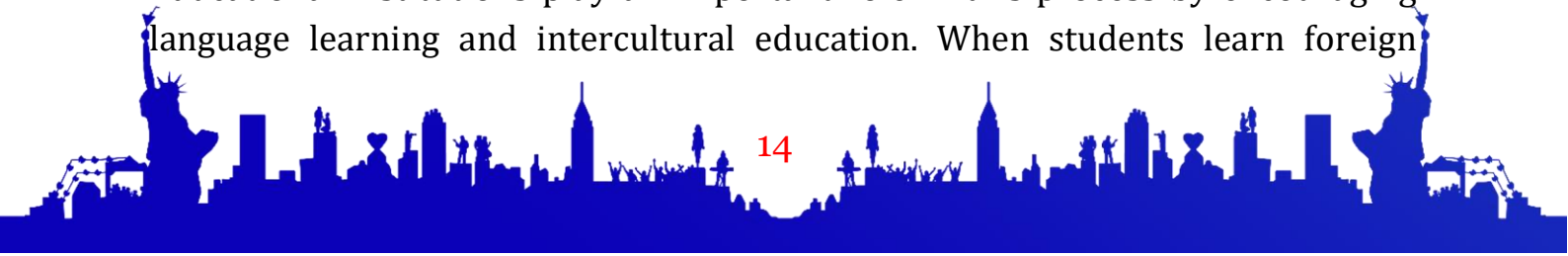
