**Integrative approach** – combines biological and social determinants

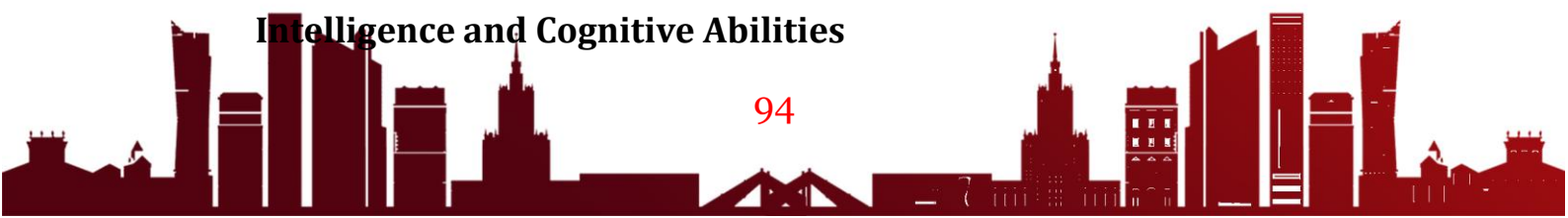
These approaches provide a comprehensive framework for understanding personality development and individual variability.

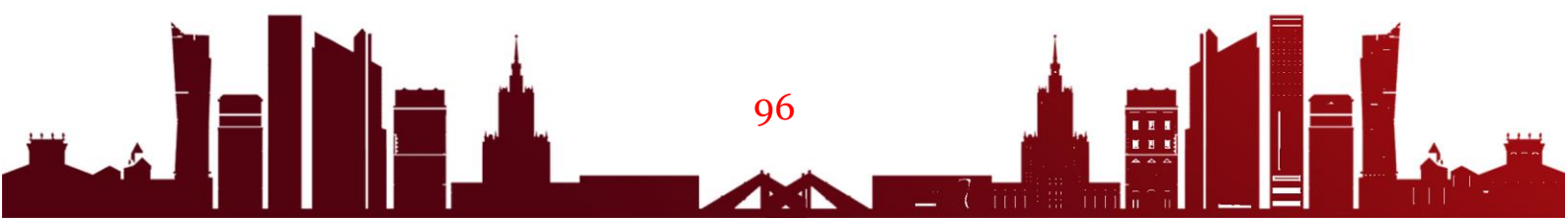
